# Report of the 5th Worldwide Reunion

It was wonderful attending the 5<sup>th</sup> Maryknoll Worldwide Reunion this summer. There were plenty of moments that touch the hearts, one way or another. The weather was perfect for the occasion from the time we left Toronto on August 5<sup>th</sup> till the day we returned on August 9<sup>th</sup>. The experience was so overwhelming that we find it difficult to include the many details.



Maryknollers are unique. There is a spirit among us that binds us, both individual and collective, that makes things happen. It started the evening we arrived in New York when Anne Kong, class of 71, invited all of her classmates and the twenty-two 'Torontonians' to dinner at her Battery Park condominium overlooking 'Ground Zero'. The energy, strength and generosity of this lady is very much appreciated.



Friday, August 6<sup>th</sup>, marked the official beginning of the Reunion, with registration of the participants, the taking of the class photographs



and the distribution of souvenirs and directories. On Saturday morning, two busloads of Maryknollers and friends descended onto Motherhouse where the Sisters warmly welcomed them with a prayer service held in the chapel. Sr. Marie Gladys Gonzalez danced to the song 'You are Mine' by David Haas. Sr. Miriam Xavier Mug and Sr. Agnes McKiernan were not well enough to attend the events in Manhattan but we had a

chance to meet with them "at home". Sr. Miriam Xavier could address each of the three girls she taught in 1955 by name. Sr. Agnes was a colleague of Gertrude Chan and they traded stories of yester-years.

joyful women who were highly educated, and acted in professional capacities as teachers, social workers, and medical personnel. The assertion of this book is that the mission provided Maryknollers what they had long desired—equal employment opportunities—which were only later emphasized in the women's liberation movement of the 1960s.

"Dr. Cindy Chu's volume is a richly documented, fair-minded, and illuminating account of the Maryknoll Sisters' experience in Hong Kong from their arrival in 1921 through the 1960s. She shows how that experience became significantly intertwined with the history of Hong Kong itself during those difficult, changeful decades as the Sisters responded to one pressing social need after another. This helping hand came at a time when the Hong Kong Government was understandably overwhelmed by the numbers of refugees that poured into the Crown Colony, especially during the 1950s. The story thus helps explain how Hong Kong managed to cope so remarkably well with some truly exceptional and formidable burdens in the mid-twentieth century, by utilizing, as it did, such fortuitously available, competent and relatively inexpensive volunteers. In turn, the selfless American Sisters were rewarded with a degree of acceptance and with conversion opportunities that, otherwise, might not as readily have been there."
