# President's Message

ince the incorporation of the MCS Alumni Ontario Chapter more than twenty years ago, we have always been fortunate to be able to generate enough income for all the activities of our members. Now, for the first time, we have to go into our reserve funds to cover the basic expenses and running costs, as mentioned by our Treasurer at our last AGM.

The major reason for this is because we no longer have the income generated from the Valentine Ball. Currently, our income is generated from the networking dinners, and membership fees. These sources of income are not enough to cover the operating costs. We are, henceforth, requesting all members for their support and I am calling on all the past presidents to join me to start "the ball rolling". This is a new initiative where monetary donations will be accepted. There are also other ways of helping your high school alumni – through participating in our functions, and asking your fellow classmates to join the alumni.

We have just drawn a sum from our reserve funds to cover our expenses, and we hope that with your help, we can minimize the future need to draw from our reserve again. We hope you can support your association.

e have been part of the family for over 80 years. Here is an excerpt from the newsletter of the Maryknoll Sisters explaining the origin of the name MARYKNOLL. The full details of the newsletter can be viewed at <a href="https://www.maryknoll.org/MKSnews">www.maryknoll.org/MKSnews</a>.

As languages evolve, some words take on new meanings and others become rather archaic. Perhaps for some younger folks today, "knoll" is not a known synonym for "hill." When Maryknoll was founded, it was commonly used and understood. From Hawthorne, NY, the original setting of the "Catholic Foreign Mission Society of America," (which is still the official title of the Maryknoll Fathers and brothers), their co-founder, Fr. James A. Walsh, wrote the following:

"Maryknoll is....the title of a dream which we hope will, before long, be realized. Maryknoll will....be the name of the knoll on which we will locate permanently our seminary building."

When the Society obtained the present site on Sunset Hill in Ossining, N.Y., they named it Maryknoll. Soon the members of the Society were known sim-

ply as the "Maryknoll Fathers and Brothers."

Devotion to the Mother of Jesus was a cornerstone in the spiritual foundation of Maryknoll. The first woman who came to work for the foreign missions by serving the newly formed Society in many clerical and domestic tasks, were frequently referred to as "the Marys of Maryknoll." Later on, when the women became a recognized religious congregation, they chose as their motto the response of Mary to the Angel: "Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it done to me according to thy word."

Although their official title was "The Foreign Mission Sisters of St. Dominic." few people knew them by any name oter than the "Maryknoll Sisters." Some years later, it was officially changed to "The Maryknoll Sisters of St. Dominic."

Worthy of note here is the fact that, even though the men's Society and the Sisters' Congregation bear the same name of "Maryknoll," the two organizations are completely separate in all respects, including finances, as is the newest entity, the Maryknoll Lay Missioners. Each group is totally independent and self-sufficient, although we often collaborate in our work for mission of Jesus and the Church.
