Before we had the association formally incorporated in 1984, we Maryknollers in Toronto have had frequent gatherings involving schoolmates spanning several years, our seniors and juniors. The idea of forming a legal entity evolved from such ad hoc meetings in May 1984 at the home of Dorothy Tsang in Scarborough, Toronto. We had a legal advisor in the person of Linda da Rocha and after more meetings, it was legally registered as an association in Toronto with me as the first president. (This is what the Chinese call 'face' since I was the teacher of many of those present.)

Since our humble beginning in 1984, our membership has grown steadily from 18 to the present enrolment of over 230, spanning between 1941 to 1997. Our mission is to foster a continual link among Maryknollers residing in Ontario and to spread the Maryknoll spirit 'to home, to country, to the world.'

2009 is the Silver Jubilee of the founding of our alumni association and we are planning a big celebration for the anniversary. Throughout the intervening years, we've had numerous fund-raising events to support the Motherhouse in New York. For our members, we had dinners, bingos, golf tournaments, picnics, mah-jong games, just to name a few. We support the world-wide reunions in various corners of the world and when called upon to host it, we gladly accepted the challenge in 1998.

We publish a quarterly newsletter for our members but any Maryknoller, whether in North America or Hong Kong or Australia, is welcome to share with us our camaraderie in Ontario. Do visit our website *www.mcsontario.org* from time to time and you'll be surprised to find a person or two you know mentioned in the newsletter.

Friday, May 16, 2008 was our Annual General Meeting when a new executive committee was elected for a term of two years. Do bear with me for a week or two before the photo of the new committee is posted onto the web. We all share the same motto, *Sola Nobilitas Virtus*, - Only Virtue Ennobles. As Mother Mary Joseph quoted from James Russell Lowell's poem, Yussouf,
