

~Flash to 25 years later - June 2009


I am standing on stage singing "O Maryknoll, O Mayknoll, Thy name most honoured be!" with the other committee members of the Maryknoll Convent Former Students (Ontario) Inc. We sing to the piano accompaniment of Joanna Wong (daughter of Alice Wong) who kindly recorded the piece at Maryknoll, HK and sent it to us especially for this occasion. I feel as if I am back in the auditorium at Maryknoll. Who would have thought that twenty-five years later we would have over 250 members and be hosting another fund raising gala at the elegant Granite Club. In front of me are 24 tables of former Maryknollers, former teachers, Sister

Earnest (all the way from Hawaii) and many friends from the United States and Australia.

We were then addressed by our President Ludia Fong (in person) and by our founder Dorothy Tsang (by pretaped video from Hong Kong). Then seven of the nine former presidents of the Association who were in attendance cut the 25th anniversary cake. It was a lemoncello cake (ever so yummy!), decorated with the school crest, made by a former Maryknoller commissioned by Patricia Wu and Jacqueline Fong.



Sister Earnest said Grace (meaningful but short, as promised) and we were treated to a culinary delight. During the dinner we watched and listened to words of congratulations and best wishes from both Sister Jeanne Houlihan and Sister Rose Duchesne (both by video from HK).



We were entertained by three performances. Christine Cheung '71 sang two of our old time favourites from "The Sound of Music", Loretta Yu Lee

'63 and Dr. Sai Ping Lee performed two ballroom dances and Dr. Jeffrey Fong, Ludia's husband (and every Maryknoller's dream hubby) sang a duet with Sister Earnest. These were not just top notch entertaining performances. They were also one of the major source of fundraising from pledges made by Maryknollers present both physically and in spirit. Thanks so much to every single one of you!

The evening seemed to go by so quickly - there was hardly enough time to catch up with so many people.....and in between, enjoying the delicious sweet table and dancing! You should have seen Sister Earnest do the 'YMCA' with the class of '71!

To top off a fabulous evening, Derek son of Dr. Shirley Cheong Chan '81 (who has always been a great supporter of all our activities and fundraising) and Ada, daughter of Connie Cheong Chan '75 presented Sister Earnest with a cheque. We raised US \$30,000!!!!!!

Urgent Appeal for Maryknoll Sisters at Motherhouse New York, U.S.A.

The current worldwide economic crisis has affected a great number of people. Many have lost jobs, their home, investments or have seen their retirement savings reduced or depleted. We pray that our members have been spared or not too severely affected by this crisis.

It has come to our knowledge that our beloved Maryknoll Sisters at the Motherhouse in New York has been seriously affected by the current financial 'tsunami'. During hard times, donations to charitable organizations, generally reduces or dries up. The Maryknoll Sisters rely heavily on donations for their operation. With so many Sisters now in their senior years and fewer and fewer young ladies joining the convent, donations make up a major part of their income.

In 2005, when economic times were much stronger, the Maryknoll Sisters undertook a major assessment of the buildings on the Motherhouse grounds. The Consultants found a range of needs from those urgent for the safety of the residents and staff to those required to sustain the structural integrity of the buildings for a long time. The plan was to look after the urgent needs immediately with the continued support of regular generous donors. The overall cost of 12 and half million dollars was to be spread over five years.

During the repairs, it was discovered that the building contained asbestos. Many years ago asbestos was commonly used in building methods and _____

materials. Today it is considered a cancer and lung disease hazard. As a result special precautions are required when repairs are done. This not only added to the cost; the asbestos when exposed, must be removed or the area may not be inhabited.

Over the past winter the boiler in the cloister building broke and the Sisters had to move out of the area until spring. Investigation is currently underway to fix the heating system economically and environmentally safe

On a recent visit to the Motherhouse by a member of our association, a pipe burst and flooded an area, indicating another urgent need.

I have only recounted some of the major expenses that the Maryknoll Sisters at the Motherhouse currently are contracted to meet. Not only have the expenses increased substantially from the original plan, but also donations from regular generous supporters have dramatically reduced or have stopped. A double whammy so to speak!!!

We are told that the Sisters have cut many expenses, services and have done without where possible. What particularly concern me are the needs of the old and sick Sisters. I know that they will continue to receive the best and loving care they have always received. I just hope that circumstances will not alter this.

The Executives of Maryknoll Convent Former Students (Ontario) Inc. have dedicated the rest of our term to raise funds for the Motherhouse. We acknowledge that what we hope to raise may be a drop in the bucket, but a drop is better that nothing at all. We are also appealing to all our members to donate what they can, when they can to help Maryknoll who gave us so many Sisters, who left home, loved ones and country to help make us what we are today.
