Sister Virginia Flagg (Sister Stella Marie)



was born in Yonkers, NY in 1912, the same year that Mother Mary Joseph Rogers founded the Maryknoll Sisters! After finishing one year in Mt. St. Vincent College, NYC, she joined Maryknoll in 1930 from St. Dennis Parish, Yonkers, NY. She earned a B.A. in English from Mt. St. Vincent College and was assigned to Manchuria in 1935, never expecting to see her family

again. During WWII, Sister Virginia was interned for two years in Dairen and Shanghai and repatriated in 1943 on the M.S. Gripsholm, after 75 days at sea.

After teaching ten years in Hawaii, she became Superior and Principal of Transfiguration Convent and School, Chinatown, NY. This led to Hong Kong where she was Sister Superior of the Maryknoll Sisters in the Far East. Sister later became Principal of the Maryknoll Sisters School on Blue Pool Road.

Back in the States, Sister Virginia earned an M.A. in Administration and Supervision in Education from St. John's University. She was Dean of Rogers College and Director of Continuing Education. Her leadership qualities were tapped as Coordinator of Maryknoll Sisters Center; Monrovia Retirement Community; and Certified Director of Activities in Maryknoll Residential Care.

Sister Virginia was our closest link to Mother Mary Joseph and the 'early days of Maryknoll.' She added beauty and shared her spirituality as an artist and poet. We will miss her very much.



Maria Tang-Tse (Mother of Margaret Tse Sie – MCS '78) passed away peacefully on Wednesday, February 16, 2011, after an eight month courageous fight with colon cancer in Toronto. She was surrounded by her family and loved ones at her bedside in Toronto General Hospital.

Maria was born in Guangzhou on November 26, 1929. She received her early childhood education in Shanghai. Maria also attended Pui Ching Primary School in Hong Kong; True Light Primary School in Guangzhou and Hip Woo Primary School in Macau. Her middle school years were spent at Wah Ying Middle School at Fat Shan, Guangdong province, China. Maria then went to Fu Ren University in Beijing to study Childhood Education.

Upon returning to Hong Kong, Maria was trained to be a Registered Nurse at the Hong Kong Sanatorium. Maria was married to Dr. David Tse in 1957.

Maria is survived by her husband, Dr. David Tse and their four children: Frederick, Gregory, Margaret and Esther Tse.

A Memorial Mass was celebrated at St. Justin Martyr Catholic Church, on February 26, 2011 in Markham, Ontario.

Lily was born in Hong Kong and immigrated to Canada with her husband, Asa, in 1985 to join their children.

Lily was highly regarded by her family as well as in her community. She attended Sacred Heart Canossian College on Cain Road, Hong Kong. To her, education was of prime importance and she encouraged everyone to pursue it to the fullest. Lily had a special knack for numbers and could remember and recite everyone's phone numbers – a feat that few can surpass!

Knitting was another one of Lily's special talents. During her 98 years of lifespan, she must have knitted hundreds of items — coats, suits, sweaters, vests, hats, scarves, socks, mittens, cushions, dolls, blankets etc. Anything that one would name, Lily could knit — without the use of a pattern! Her superb craftsmanship won her a "runner-up" title in one of Hong Kong's Knitting Competitions.

Needless to say, playing mahjong was Lily's passion. That was her most favorite pastime. Since she outlived the majority of her mahjong contemporaries, she condescended to playing with her three daughters. Believe it or not, at the very last mahjong game played three months ago, Lily beat all three daughters to the pulp! She was a sharp cookie till the very end!

Nationals entering the USA under the Visa Waiver Program (VWP) require individual biometric passports or machine-readable passports valid for at least 90 days from the date of entry, and are to provide details on-line 72 hours prior to travel. Nationals who require a visa are requested to apply accordingly in advance.
- 2 Individuals are required to make their own personal insurance arrangements.

- 3. NO alcoholic beverages and tobacco products may be purchased during this trip in view of Custom complications affecting this tour.
