Our gala event took place on Sunday in the entire second floor of our host hotel. We started off in one ballroom with a reception, class photos, a silent auction and of





handicapped. Later, as she gained more confidence from her employer, Vera got more involved in her employer's daily activities, even access to her bank account.

The situation continued until one day Firoz Jogiat, who had been delivering medication to Norma every week for the past 10 years, found an unfamiliar man answering the door. Although the person claimed to be a family friend of the elderly lady, Firoz remembered that Norma had mentioned in the past that she only had one relative living in Montreal. A week later, on delivery again, Firoz found the man acting strangely so he requested to see Norma, whom he found was confined to a small room, looking very scared and confused when he tried to make conversation.

Back at the pharmacy, Firoz told **Selina Chan-Ying,** who felt that this was not a simple case. She notified the Police. Vera Nunes, 32, and her husband Luis Serpa Da Conceicao Santos, 38, both of Toronto, were arrested and charged with fraud and misconduct as well as unlawful dwelling. Thanks to Selina, Norma Marshall has regained her home, security and freedom.
