The Memorial Mass for Sister Miriam Xavier Mug (1913-2015) was held on Saturday, May 9, 2015 at 10 am at St. Gabriel Church, North York. Sister passed away in New York on Tuesday March 31, 2015 at 3pm. She would have been at her tender age of 102 on September 22, 2015 otherwise.

The Mass was attended by close to 30 former students and friends. Fatima Lee Luk did a great job in coordinating for all the arrangements. Father Paul Cusack, C.P. was the Celebrant. There was a choir comprising of : Nora Man, Wendy Man, Marie-Louise Rocha Chang, Jeanne Ho Chan and Juliana Shee Joe. Shirley Kwong and Regina da Rocha Chan assisted in Gift-Bearing.

Marie-Louise Rocha Chang delivered an impressive Eulogy on the heart-warming life of Sister and Father Paul Cusack gave a very touching homily. Donations received have been sent to the Sisters at Motherhouse.

Homily - Father Paul Cusack, C.P.

It's hard to imagine what Sister Miriam saw and experienced in her 101 years of living. She was a Maryknoll Sister for 71 years. Imagine what changes and struggles she went through as a religious missionary and as a Catholic during those years. She saw six popes come and go. She lived through the renewal of religious life called for by the Vatican Council II, and she saw the bright light of Pope Francis. She went to the Orient in 1946 as the area struggled to re-build itself after the Second World War. Most of her life was spent there.

All of you here were touched by the personality and spirituality of the wonderful woman. In the eulogy from the Maryknoll community, there is a quote of hers: "I treasure the satisfaction that comes when I see women I taught as teenagers now grown into responsible women, with lives based on the ideals expressed in their Maryknoll education." Eric Erikson describes that as "generativity" in his seventh stage of growth.

Each one of you has your own memories of Sister Miriam. If she was a good teacher, she was probably

demanding and strict, wanting to get the best out of her students. St. Paul tells us something we already know- the life and death of each of us has its influence on others. We cannot go through life untouched or untouching. Your lives were touched by her, and her life was enriched by her association with you. For this you must be grateful.

Our gospel sums up everything. When life is over we will be judged by love alone. Matthew has nothing to say about temple of church attendance, the praying of prayers or the keeping of fasts. He speaks only of love in action – I was hungry, thirsty, naked, lonely, and shut-in, and you were there for me. Now I am here for you - come.

This Mass is a mass of thanksgiving for the life and ministry, the friendship and example of Sister Miriam Xavier. We know she is enjoying the life and love of God for all eternity

Records show that the 92-year-old building's windows haven't been replaced since the 1950s. Many are cracked and damaged and most will only open a few inches, if at all. "We've all spent our lives working toward the betterment of our missions," 84-year-old Sister Jeanne Houlihan says, in explaining the prevailing attitude. "We tend to accept what is, and hope something will change. We don't complain about our own discomforts. I may want something, but I ask myself if I really need it. If I find that I don't, I won't ask for it."

But even Houlihan, who spent 46 years running a school for girls in Hong Kong, now acknowledges the need to replace the convent's 403 windows, at a cost of about \$1,200 each. The order has produced a [YouTube video](#) describing the need.

"It will take a lot of hands and a lot of hearts to make this a success," she said of the new effort to raise the money. "But one thing we have plenty of here is faith. It would be a great comfort for us to be able to open and close our windows."
